ever due, Subject to my debts above

Sixth. I hereby appoint my said

son James & thence, or the survivors
of them, Executors of this my last
will and Testament.

Know all Men! that I Samuel Atkinson of Raisinville in the County of Monroe and State of Michigan being of sound mind and reasonable health, but knowing the uncertainty of this life, do hereby make, establish and declare this testament to be my Last Will and Testament, Hereby revoking and annulling all former wills I may have heretofore made.

First. I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Mary Atkinson the farm in said Raisinville on which I now live with the appurtenances. Bounded North by the River Raisin. East by land of Joseph Atkinson. South by land of Ludwig Knapp and West by land of James Atkinson. Containing One hundred and fifty two acres of land, more or less. To hold the same to my said wife for her care, separate use and benefit for the full term of her natural life.

Second. I give and bequeath to my two sons Jonathan and William Atkinson the equal undivided shares My home from above described to hold the same to them jointly for their joint use and benefit for their joint lives, Subject always to the life estate therein, herein before bequeathed to my said wife.

Third. I give and bequeath to my said son Jonathan and to his heirs and assigns from. My home farm above described and the appurtenances subject always to the life estates herein before bequeathed to my said wife Mary and to my said son William.

Fourth. I give and bequeath to my said wife Mary Atkinson all the furniture, stock farming tools, carriages, crops, hay, main provisions and other personal property belonging to me which may be in the house or about my premises at the time of my decease subject only to the payment of my just debts and funeral expenses. I also so give to my said wife all my notes, accounts, and demands of what ever nature subject to my debit as above.

Fifth. I hereby appoint my said wife Mary Atkinson and my son James Atkinson, or the survivor of them, Executors of this my Last Will and Testament.
